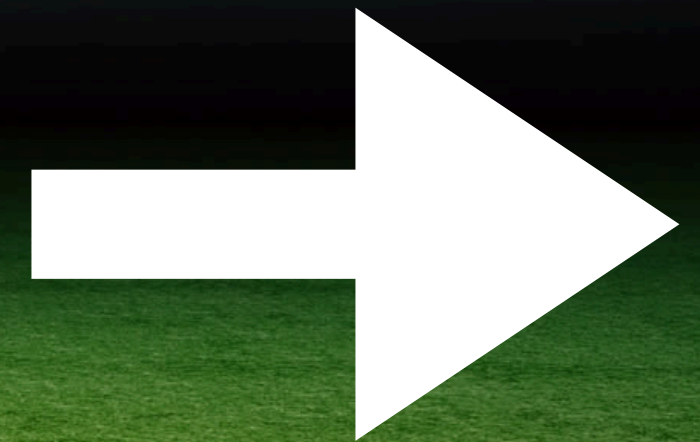

LEE DYKES

TECHNICAL DIRECTOR, BRENTFORD FC

Lee's role at Brentford sits exactly at the intersection we're trying to help the grassroots game understand:

The link between performance, environment, individual needs, psychology, recruitment, pathways and player welfare. It's this whole-system view - the part of elite football most people never get to see, that makes his insight so powerful.

Under Lee's leadership, Brentford have become a club where wellbeing, belonging and performance are designed to coexist, not compete. He has been central to building a coherent, values-driven culture and a needs-led approach to player and coach welfare - ensuring individuals are supported as humans first and athletes second.

For the grassroots game, this is an extraordinary opportunity - lessons about culture, cohesion, psychological safety, development pathways and what truly unlocks performance.

Lee will give FMHA Academy members a rare window into how an elite club builds an environment around the needs of its people - and how grassroots clubs can adapt these principles in practical, achievable ways.



CHARLIE AUSTIN

EX SOUTHAMPTON, BURNLEY, QPR

Charlie Austin is a former Premier League striker, UEFA B licensed coach and advocate for neurodiversity in football. His career has been marked by determination, goal-scoring prowess and a recent commitment to promoting understanding of neurodevelopmental conditions in the sport.

In 2024, at the age of 34, Charlie was diagnosed with combined ADHD. This diagnosis came after both of his daughters were identified as having ADHD and autism. His personal experience as both a professional footballer and a parent of neurodivergent children provides him with unique insights into the challenges faced by neurodivergent individuals in football.

Since his diagnosis, Charlie has become a passionate advocate for neurodiversity inclusion in football and is seeing an increased number of current and ex-professionals reach out to him in confidence to discuss the condition after sensing they may be neurodivergent.

Charlie brings his wealth of experience as a professional footballer, a coach and his personal journey with neurodiversity to the Academy, offering an unparalleled base of knowledge and experience in the arena of neurodiversity and professional football.

FOUNDER, SAFEGUARDING TODAY

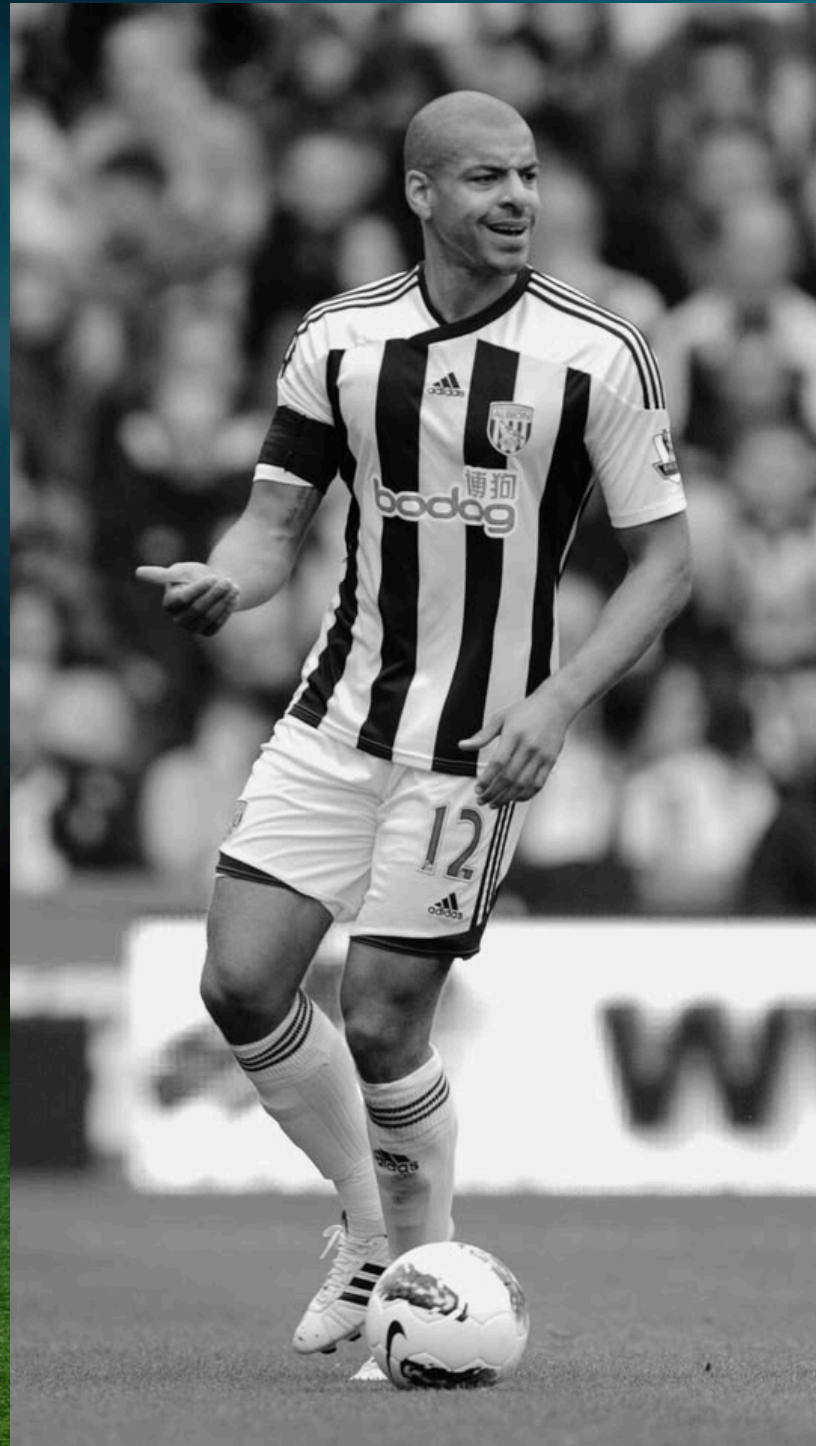
Jennie is a Criminal Barrister with over 15 years of experience working in the criminal justice system.

His key achievements include helping Scotland qualify for the 2020 Euros, and as First Team Coach at Nottingham Forest, being part of the team that guided the club to the Premier League, as well as being Interim Manager of Forest, following the dismissal of Chris Hughton, before joining Steve Cooper's coaching team as his Assistant.

Steven's role as a Coach, Mentor and Counsellor, as well as his experience with mental health, gives him unique skills to help England's young players improve their own mental well-being, confidence and leadership.

FOUNDER, THRIVE LAW

Jodie Hill is a neurodivergent solicitor, ED&I consultant, coach and trainer, author and campaigner.

She is passionate about employment law, mental health and wellbeing, equality, diversity and inclusion (ED&I), and neurodiversity.

A qualified barrister initially called to the Bar by The Honourable Society of the Inner Temple in 2010, Jodie then cross-qualified to become a solicitor in 2013.

Her mental breakdown in 2017, which Jodie now describes as her “mental breakthrough”, led her to establish Thrive Law in 2018. It was the first law firm in the UK founded with wellbeing and mental health at its heart.

Today, Thrive Law, headquartered in Leeds with teams in London and the Southwest, delivers HR and employment law support to employers and employees. A focus on ED&I, mental health, wellbeing and neurodiversity underpins its mission to ensure everyone can thrive in the setting they are in.

This has included assessments of autism, ADHD and intellectual/learning disability.

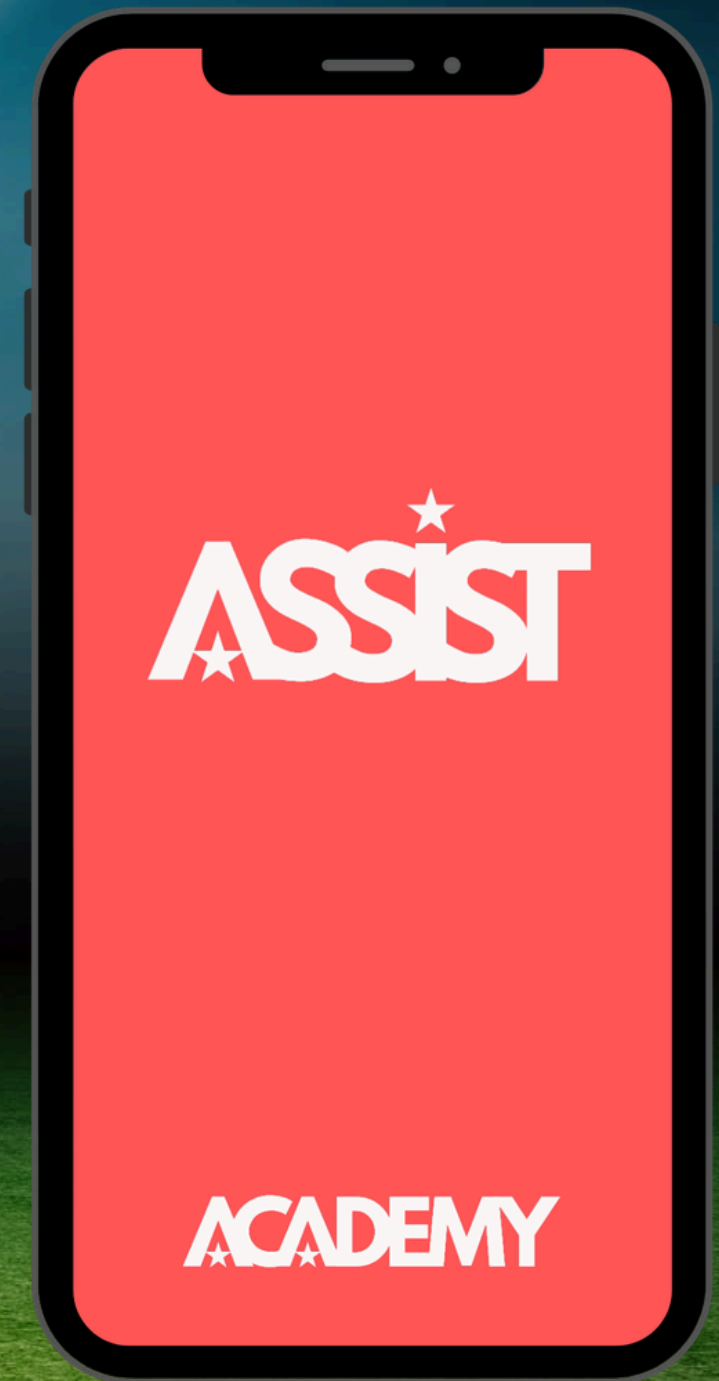

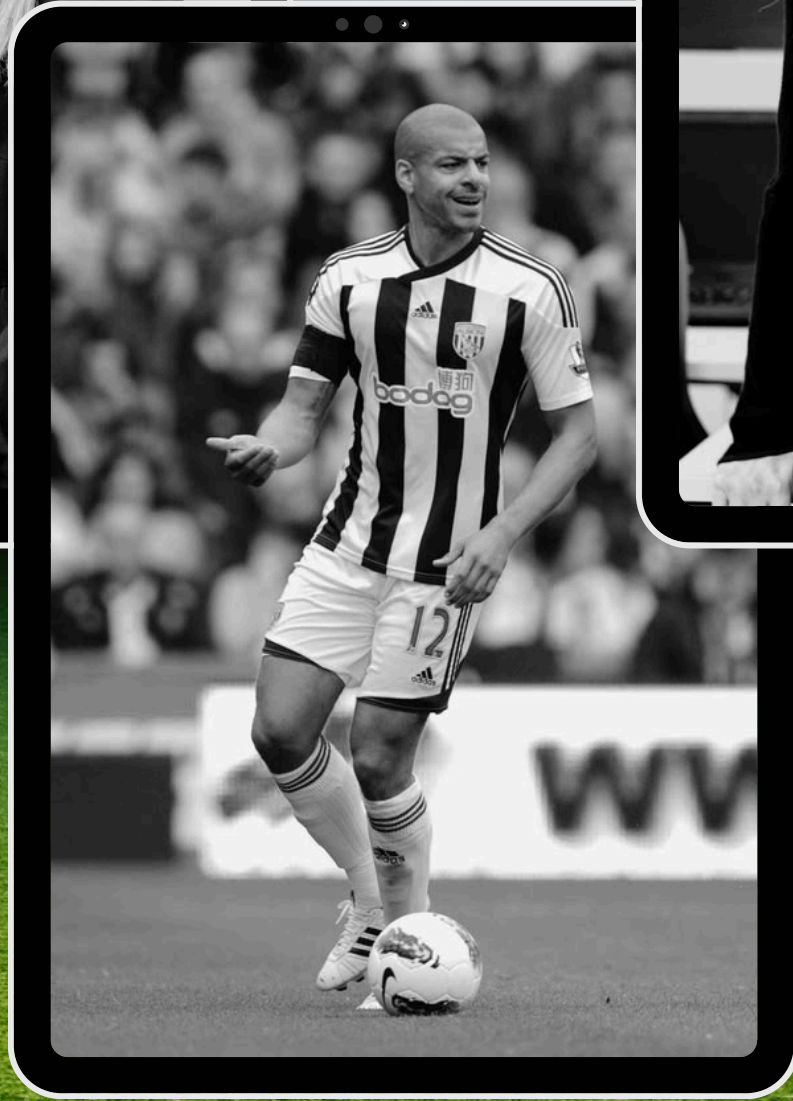
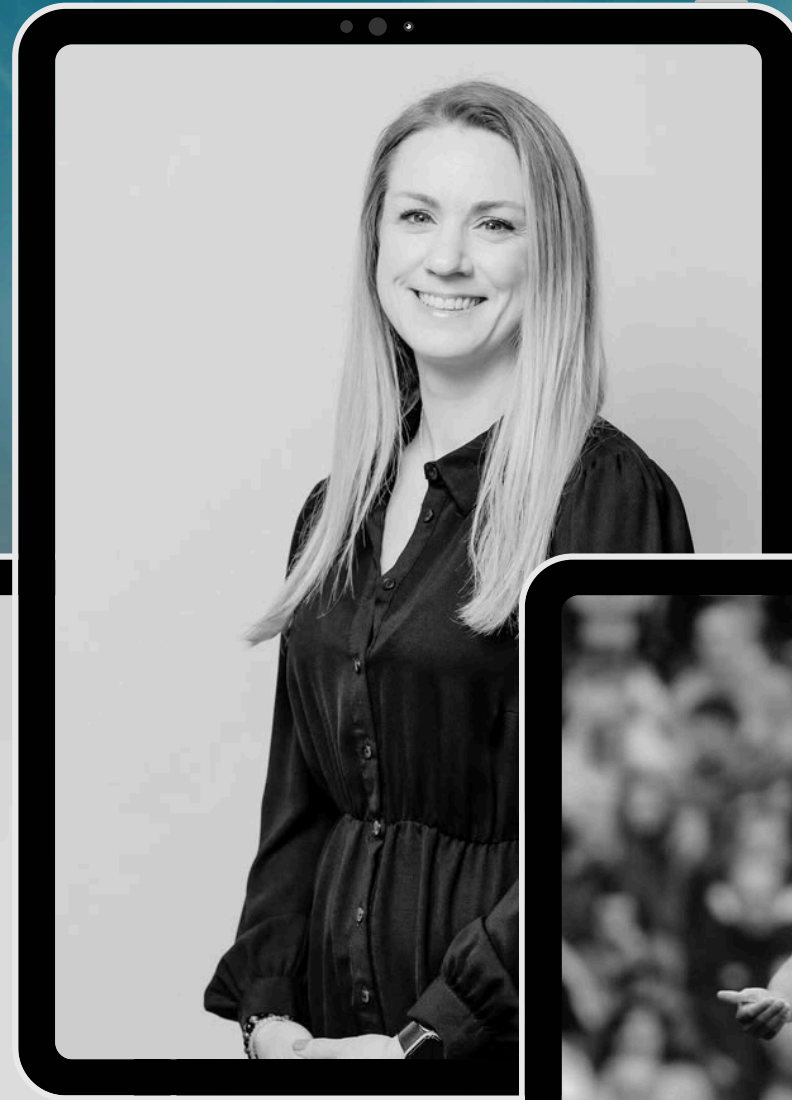
